Garbage / Recycling Bins

As a reminder, all garbage cans and should be located or screened so that they're concealed from view of Broad Street.

[Article 10.11 of the Covenants states that all garbage cans "shall be located or screened to be concealed from view of adjacent streets." Except, of course, when you wheel them out in front of your home for Tuesday & Friday pickup.)]

Also, don't forget that the **trash bins** for weekly regular garbage pick-up
are not to be placed on the sidewalk
before Thursday evening for Friday
morning pickup and should be removed by
Friday evening. **Recycle bins** for the biweekly recycle pick-up are not to be
placed on the sidewalk before Monday
evening and should be removed by
Tuesday evening (unless trash pick-up
days are delayed for holidays).



Meanwhile, **thanks to Everyone** – for pulling in neighbors' trash bins when they are away or forget.


Annual Dues Reminder

Landscaping Reminders

With warmer weather arriving, it's time to remember that landscaping is required according to our Covenants.

That means it's time to break out those **rakes** and lawnmowers! **Leaves should be**





them from ruining grass or blowing into neighbor's yards. Blowing leaves and/or grass trimmings into the street is not allowed.

Also: trees greater than 6" inches in diameter may not be removed without prior approval from the BAC.

Lawton Farms Update

We know many folks may want to get outside and plant flowers or shrubs this spring. We wanted to remind everyone that the drainage project on the Lawton Farms side of our neighborhood **IS**

NOT COMPLETE YET.

The BSNA has been working with the City to finalize any outstanding items including approved plants for a natural border.

Because that property
belongs to the City of Beaufort,
Broad Street residents are not to plant
anything in the Lawton Farms drainage
area without prior approval from the BAC.

Once we have a finalized list of approved plants and/or shrubs, we'll circulate that to everyone.
